Kathy's Final Accounting

As I end my duties as your treasurer, I am pleased to report that AramcoBrats, Inc. has a bank balance of \$42,235.28. There have been a few wrap-up transactions following the last quarter, thus the difference between the \$42,235.28 balance and the balance in the quarterly report presented here. Although the number of AdBaks received was down (745 this term, 1057 last term) and the reunion attendance numbers were down (the world changed after the May 2001 Tucson reunion), the total donation dollars more than doubled this term (\$12,870.20 this term, up from \$5,928 last term) and the reunion auction and raffle profit was up by over \$2,000 as well! Thank you to each and every one of you who have contributed in making your AramcoBrats, Inc. the successful organization that it is!

Per the bylaws, there has been an in-depth audit of the financial records, and Annie Oskam DH '74 was kind enough to volunteer to do the audit again. After completing the audit, on Oct. 19, 2003, Annie reported, "In reviewing these records I have checked for accuracy, consistency with banking and subsidiary journals, as well as conformity to generally accepted accounting practices (GAAP)... In keeping with past years, the work presented by Ms. Montgomery was detailed, orderly and supported completely the initial financial reports..."

Finally, I have loved being your Treasurer for the last four years. From the bottom of my heart, I thank all of you for your support. As I confidently pass the spreadsheet(s) to the efficient hands of Cathie McCoy, RT74, I'd like everyone to join me in thanking her for being there for all of us.

sentative of the Year Award.
